


Widening participation and spreading excellence

Reforming and Enhancing the European R&I system

Missions shall be programmed within the Pillar II, 'Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness', but may also benefit from actions carried out within other parts of the Programme as well as complementary actions carried out under other Union funding programmes.

Missions – definition and key reports



Research and innovation missions

- Strong visibility and impact
- Achieve a bold, inspirational and measurable goal within a set timeframe
- Find solutions to some of the major challenges faced by European citizens



Lamy Report (2017)

Build a true EU innovation policy that creates future markets

- Design the EU R&I programme for greater impact
- Adopt a mission-oriented, impactfocused approach to address global challenges
- Privilege impact over process
- Mobilise and involve citizens
- Align EU, national and private R&I investments
- Capture and better communicate impact







1st Mazzucato report (2018)

R&I missions should:

- Be bold and inspirational, with wide societal relevance;
- Indicate a clear direction: targeted, measurable and time-bound;
- Be ambitious but realistic research and innovation actions;
- Spark innovation across disciplines, sectors and actors;
- Be based on a bottom-up approach of multiple solutions







1st Mazzucato report (2018)

Examples of missions:

- 100 carbon neutral cities by 2030
- A plastic-free ocean
- Decreasing the burden of dementia





2nd Mazzucato report (2019)

Implementation of missions:

- Engage citizens in co-designing, co-creating, co-implementing and co-assessing missions
- Innovation in public sector capabilities
- Mission-oriented finance and funding to leverage and crowd-in other forms of finance

What a EU mission is NOT

Missions are an entirely new approach based on portfolios of actions working towards broadly defined goals, and should not be confused with existing methods and instruments i.e. missions are not the same as

- R&I Programmes
- R&I Partnerships
- Focus Areas from Horizon 2020
- Single projects or topics
- Horizon Europe Clusters

Mission Boards

- Top-level independent experts (max 15 per mission area)
- Sectoral, gender and geographical balance
- Mixture of high level profiles from research and academia, industry, innovation and business, policy, public sector, citizens associations, public engagement and science education, international agencies, civil society organisations, foundations, finance and communication



Mission Board role

Mission Boards will **advise** the European Commission on:

- Identification of one or more missions in the respective mission area, with input from stakeholders and citizens
- Content of work programmes, with input from stakeholders and citizens
- Characteristics of project portfolios for missions
- Adjustment actions, or termination if appropriate
- Selection and briefing of independent expert evaluators, specific evaluation criteria and their weighting;
- Framework conditions which help achieve the objectives of the mission
- Communication
- Policy coordination/synergies
- Key performance indicators



Mission Assemblies

- Top-level experts (max 30 per mission area)
- To provide
 - source of additional ideas, knowledge and expertise that will contribute to the success of the missions
 - support to citizen engagement work for the mission, such as liaison with NGOs



Dialogue with Member States and European Parliament



Mission Sub-groups of the Shadow Programme Committee

- Regular meetings with the Commission and members of Mission Boards for open exchange on identification of specific missions in the Horizon Europe Strategic Plan (early 2020)
- Feedback to the Horizon Europe Shadow Programme Committee
- Identify key national events for co-design of missions with citizens
- Identify relevant national programmes to join forces for accomplishing the missions


